## Location

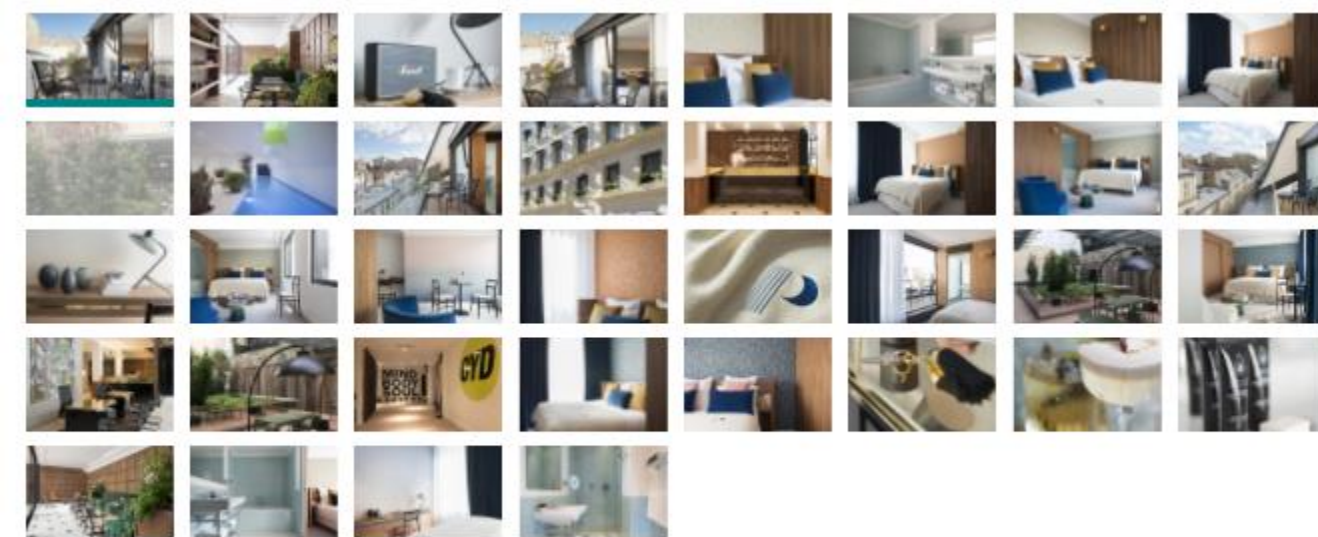
Le Parister is located on a quieter street in the lovely 9th arrondissement. There are ample bars and restaurants within close walking distance, including the popular spots on and around Rue des Martyrs such as La Fourmi and Lulu White. For more traditional tourist offerings, the Palais Garnier opera is less than 20 minutes away by foot and the Galeries Lafayette and surrounding shops are a 15-minute walk away. Métro Cadet is two minutes away and connects to the Louvre, Marais and St Germain via Line 7.

## Style & character

The property comprises two buildings, the first a typical Paris Haussmann-style block, the second a new build. Communal spaces – lounge areas, restaurant and bar – are arranged in a horseshoe around the interior courtyard, which features hand-engraved concrete, dark wood decking on the floors and walls, and contemporary patio furniture.

Interiors blend traditional Parisian glamour – think gleaming tiled floors, marble-effect table-tops and green velvet banquettes – with a contemporary finish and abundant flora, including tropical blooms, free-standing pot plants and dried flower arrangements. The overall feel is chic and fresh and the courtyard space is particularly pleasant for an evening cocktail.



## Service & facilities

Service is friendly and attentive and staff are quick to respond to queries and requests. The hotel has teamed up with hip Parisian exercise company CYD (Conquer Your Day) to create a programme of six “wellness” classes per day, which take place in a flashy gym on the basement floor of the hotel. Classes include boxing, core training, yoga and mindfulness, with special sessions for children.

Next door to the gym is an attractive 18 metre-long swimming pool, lit by glass skylights. A hammam is available and guests may book solo or couples’ massages. Guests may also borrow bicycles from the hotel at no extra charge. Smartphones equipped with unlimited local and international calls and local recommendations are provided.

## Rooms

Rooms are warm and inviting, decorated with plush beige carpets and lit with soft yellow-tinted light. The décor blends eras, with touches of Seventies retro – think wood panelling and chunky gold light fixtures – combined with more contemporary soft furnishings and traditional Parisian ceiling mouldings. Firm beds are made up with white cotton sheets and a cosy wool throw; soundproofing is effective. Bathrooms are bright and clean, featuring summery aquamarine tiles. Robes, slippers and fruity Zenology toiletry minis are provided. Most rooms feature rain showers, with tubs available in some – be sure to ask on booking.

Tech-wise, rooms come equipped with a coffee machine, a Marshall Bluetooth speaker and a wall-mounted television. There was no remote in my room when I arrived and the phone line to reception didn’t work, but these were clearly first week teething problems and were quickly rectified.

## Food & drink

Les Passerelles restaurant serves a light, flavoursome menu of modern French small plates, sharing plates and four main dishes, with an emphasis on fresh, seasonal ingredients. Highlights include an avocado and crab tartare (€14/£12) and a delicate mushroom and foie gras ravioli (€22/£19). The bar offering comes from Paris cocktail specialists, Le Distract. Mixologists serve the classics as well as a range of specials, starting from €12 (£10.60). It also offers the biggest French whisky selection in the world, and is open until 2am.

Breakfast comprises a small buffet of high-quality foods. The mini pastries are particularly good. Bread, yoghurt, cold meats and cheeses and a fruit salad are also on offer. Coffee is made to order.

## Value for money

Double rooms from €250 (£223) in low season; and from €500 (£445) in high. The breakfast buffet is priced at €25 (£22). Free Wi-Fi. Exercise classes are €25 (£22) per session.
