Need to decorate an outdoor space on a budget? These high-design pieces have unexpectedly good value



Every designer knows that some clients concentrate their budget on the most-used rooms in the house, leaving little for secondary spaces. So what should you do if your budget starts to run dry before you've had a chance to furnish an outdoor area? Luckily, many brands offer wonderful pieces at an attainable price point that won't compromise the vision you've established in the rest of the house. We've rounded up pieces to help you create a perfectly curated patio, poolside, or picnic setup. From Sunbrella fabrics with a hand-woven feel to durable powder-coated tables, these pieces have more than just their alfresco appeal in common—they've got good value, too.

Ferm Living Bau Planters, starting at \$44

The often-overlooked balcony box gets a design-minded upgrade with this powder-coated galvanized-steel version from Ferm Living. It hints at an almost industrial aesthetic but feels decidedly modern in of-the-moment matte colors like dusty rose, slate blue, and forest green. Available in two-floor planter styles, each piece from the Bau collection includes a built-in reservoir with a drainage hole. fermliving.com

Nanimarquina Shade Outdoor Rugs, starting at \$1,774

These color-gradient rugs—originally created as indoor styles—are now available in outdoor versions for less than the price of their interior-only counterparts (which start at \$2,151). But that doesn't mean any quality is lost: The rugs are hand-loomed with water- and weather-resistant PET fibers that are surprisingly similar to natural fibers. nanimarquina.com

CB2 Breton Sun Lounger, \$899

Designed by Barcelona-based Mermelada Estudio, this matte-black powder-coated lounge is meant to evoke the essence of French coastal living in the 1960s. It has a subtly integrated recline feature so your client can choose his or her ideal degree of lounge when catching rays.

Dims Rove Side Table, \$120

Designed with a built-in handle to make it easily transportable, the Rove side table—made with scratch-resistant powder-coated steel—can move with you from indoors to out and back again in a cinch. A bonus: Dims' direct-to-consumer approach means the brand shares its pricing structure openly, and this table comes in at less than half of the cost of a comparable designer piece. The strength of the steel used to create this chair—designed by Wendy Legro and Maarten Collignon of the Netherlands-based Studio WM—allowed the designers to use thin pieces that lend it an airy quality. It's powder-coated for durability and weather resistance. nanninez.com

Croft House's Sierra Sofa is handmade in Los Angeles and completely customizable—down to the Sunbrella upholstery and the color powder coating on its industrial steel frame. The handsome frame, slung-strap backing, and plush poly-fiber-filled cushions add chic and modern style to an outdoor living space. crofthouse.com

Dedon Cirql Armchair, starting at \$840

This season, Dedon's Cirql chair designed by Werner Aisslinger makes its debut in three new shades: Ginger, Bluestone, and Jade. Its artful geometric design and intricate woven patterns make it feel more like a delicate indoor-only piece than one that can withstand harsh outdoor conditions—though, lucky for your client, it can. dedon.us

The new Waits sconce from Arteriors is built for outdoor use, but it has all the sexiness of lighting that's usually only reserved for indoor fixtures—including an aged-brass finish and opal glass. Hang it vertically or horizontally to suit your design best. arteriors.com

Because they're made from naturally antibacterial hemp fibers, Tantuvi's bold new rugs—which are hand-dyed and handwoven by artisans in Rajasthan, India—work well in covered outdoor areas. tantuvistudio.com

Named for its roomy 21-inch-wide seat, the 21 Chair has a steel and aluminum construction, can be color-customized, and is stackable for easy storage. It's durable enough to be used in high-traffic commercial areas, but stylish enough for a private residence. landscapeforms.com

The pared-down design and simple curve lines of this rattan rocker give it a sculptural quality—one might take it as a work of art. It's treated with a clear lacquer seal, making it suitable for shady verandas and sun-drenched patios alike. anthropologie.com

When Sien + Co began designing its Maya Collection—a range of textiles and throw pillows using Sunbrella fibers—the brand wanted it to have the look and feel of its hand-woven pieces. The pillows are UV-, mold-, mildew-, and stain-resistant. So, they're super durable and perfect for outdoor use, but also have a soft, texturized feel. sienandco.com

Designed as sculptural pieces of furniture that use simple geometric shapes, these colorful tables by designer Tristan Lohner are not only aesthetically eye-catching, they're durable, too. Built to withstand the elements, they're treated with weather-, scratch-, and UV-resistant powder-coated paint. Choose from three formats (round, square, and rectangular), five heights, seven sizes, and 24 colors. fermobusa.com

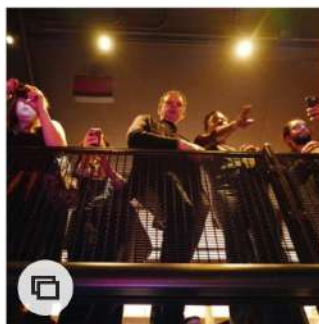
